

How to fail a seminar



- Topic not addressed
- Plagiarism
- Missed deadlines
- No attendance in seminar talks
- Seminar paper has low level of quality (content, grammar, spelling)
- Bad presentation
- Ignoring further rules and guidelines (review, presentation)
